A Tribute to the Love of My Life John J. Millburn (May 12, 1957 – November 18, 2024)



It is with an extremely, lonely heart that I write this tribute to my husband, John J. Millburn.

Many of you are aware of John's passing on November 18, 2024 following a long, courageous battle with Esophageal Cancer. John was private about his health issues and chose not to share them openly, so I respected his wishes. Of course, keeping secrets is not one of my better attributes. So, I wanted to take this opportunity to share more about the man that I loved and still do.

John was a devoted husband, father, son, Pappy (to Madisyn, his pride and joy), brother and a friend to many of you in Three Rivers Bernese Mountain Dog Club. John and I were married 44 years ago at Heinz Chapel in Oakland. He was a hero to many after serving as a Police Officer, Firearms Instructor and DARE Officer for 43 years. John took great pride in "Protecting and Serving" our community and even more so ... his family and friends. He had a firm, but gentle way, of treating those around him. I never heard anyone saying anything but loving comments about John ... except for maybe a few that he arrested!

John loved kids, which made him a perfect Baseball and Soccer Coach, Fox Chapel Baseball Booster President, DARE Officer, Father and Grandfather. He had a special rapport with children. He loved to tease them and enjoyed it more when they teased him back ... but they all loved and respected him.

Although John did not have pets growing up ... that came to a quick end when we first met. Apparently his love for animals must have been bottled up inside of him for all those years! I remember showing up at John's front door with Luke, my German Shepherd. His Mom's face was fearful, but I turned her into a dog lover too! Then ... there were two rabbits, a tree frog, Riley and Pecker (our ducks), Magnum the German Shepherd and ... then came the Berners! John loved to tell stories about all of them. When we first visited Bev and Ken to meet the breed John said, "I love the Breed, but who in the hell would have three!" Well several years later, we did! Over the course of the last 30 years, we have had nine Berners and one foster. John loved all of our Berners and even more so the lasting friendships that we developed over the years in TRBMDC. To name a few ... our trip to Switzerland for the 100th Anniversary of the Swiss Club, attending multiple National BMDCA Specialties, Chief Hotdog Chef at our TRBMDC Specialties, fall retreats at Oglebay and the list goes on and on.

One of John's final requests was that any memorial donations, in his memory, be sent to TRBMDC Rescue. I am overwhelmed and proud to say that TRBMDC has received \$2,190 to date in memory of John. Thanks to many of you for your generosity.

John ... it is incredibly difficult without you by my side. You were my rock; and I love you and will miss you forever. The TRBMDC memorial bench (in Monroeville Park) now has a new member to honor.



PASSIVE RESCUE: JULIA AIRGOOD

Julia shared that she and Donna Millburn visited a rescue named Izzy at Animal Protectors of Allegheny Valley. Izzy was turned over by her owners after she had to have her third operation to remove a foreign object from her digestive tract. Izzy was a wonderful girl and seemed to respond well to training. However, it was going to be a challenge to place due to her desire to eat everything ... regardless if it was edible or not. It was reported that Izzy is safe at the shelter; however, her adoption fee was high to help cover the surgery that Animal Protectors paid for. The high fee and impulsive eating habits are making her difficult to place. We attempted to convince the shelter to allow the National Bernese Mountain Dog Rescue to intervene to assist in the adoption. Animal Protectors has been slow to respond, but TRBMDC will continue to follow Izzy and offer help.

In addition, Benjamin Buttons, is a male rescue with a deformity in his back causing incontinence. His tail will be docked in January to keep him cleaner. Tails of Hope is the rescue; and they have been communicating with Julia. The National Bernese Mountain Dog Rescue is now on the case to help find an appropriate owner. Benjamin will also be a difficult Berner to place due to his special needs.

A third rescue, a 6-1/2 yr. old female in the Pittsburgh area is also in need of transportation help on 12/14. She needs a ride from Breezewood to Cleveland. If interested, please advise.




